March was a very busy month, starting with a new baptism of a very active young man, Aron, who is a pre-med student in Peru and very active with the ministry at the mission. We are excited that he has taken this step and is also active in the mission discipleship bible study program. God bless this young man and his walk going forth. This is our [first baptism of this year](#), our 13th since we built the baptismal. We pray that we use it again before the year is out.



On this same day, the first of March, we had a well planned out and organized (and decorated for) wedding, our first wedding at the mission. Alexander and Alba, who were married more than a decade ago in Venezuela are refugees from that country. They never had a ceremony. They both are, like Aaron, quite active in the ministry work at the mission.

March 3-5 - After these two wonderful events kicking off the month of March, I only had a few days to work with the mission teams before I had to leave.

March 5-11 - Sadly I made preparations to leave for Michigan for my father's memorial where I was to deliver the eulogy. I had just a few days to get ready, then Lily and I would drive to Lima and I would do a lengthy flight through Miami to Detroit.



This was originally planned to be a large family get together for his 95th birthday but sadly he didn't quite make it that far. The good news is that we had a wonderful family gathering with much of my family (4 children, 2 grandchildren) from California and Arizona, together with my

Projects / Events



Perú - While I was away, the mission continued to focus on the children with the 6 weekly village visits we have on our schedule, as well as 4 different Discipleship groups that meet in peoples homes and at the mission. Things were quite busy at the mission.

Sosimo and Yannirett have built a great team of volunteers of local people as well as Venezuelan friends they have made here in Peru. We continue to serve and continue to need more volunteers with all the opportunities for service that are in front of us.



March 12 - Had a night in Miraflores with my wife who came up to meet me in Lima area. We did some shopping for dental ministry in a special area of Lima, being in regular communication with Monica & Brice Dunn (both part of LAMAministry) who run our new Dental ministry.



We were looking for what we might buy in Peru versus having to transport down, in the area of portable dental needs. It was an educational visit, while texting with Brice, but other than visiting some informative shops and gaining some websites to pass on for research, we didn't exactly find what we were looking for.

March 13-15 Spent the day in Miraflores before catching an afternoon bus for Ica, returning to the mission which has been going strong with its outreach efforts.

This was about to have a major effect on us in a big way. Our ministry is working with children and people daily, much like any school, church, ministry, we were basically shut down. We expanded our prayer and bible study time accordingly and became pretty focused on God, communications and chores around campus. We really hadn't grasped that March 15 was our last real day of outside ministry for awhile.

March 21 - We are just 6 people actually living at the base during the pandemic, but we had regular visits from many of our volunteers, Angie, Alba, Alex, etc. who were also quarantined to their homes with strong restrictions on hours and purpose of travel. Many weeks Peru tried to limit days of travel by gender which was sort of silly but an effort to cut down on groups traveling. Sad part of the pandemic was all the cancelled plans for 2020. We canceled a Dental program, a Medical program, visits from a large group from Fresno, another group from Salem Oregon. We have a missionary from Alabama who has had to cancel his flights 3 times but continues to be motivated to join us, God bless him.

Our experience was similar to many of you in the United States and around the globe. In fact the president of Peru seemed to be taking his cues from whatever the USA did, as it seemed to be then announced as Peru's plan as well.



We got on the USA department of state mailing list as to what was the perspective from the view of many ex-patriots who are down here. Although the airport was closed, there seemed to be many flights of Americans leaving every week. I didn't know there were so many down here!



April 7 - Life continues at the mission with the same daily practice of morning worship and bible study, afternoon chores and late afternoon worship and intercessory prayer time. We do get occasional drop bys with some of the more rebellious youth so we keep an open door for them. The chores are plentiful, lots to do around here that needs doing for sure. From chasing pigeons away, to cleaning screens, some overdue painting, electrical work, etc.



We had started up a new construction in early March adding another floor for some anticipated staff lodging. As soon as the quarantine hit, all construction had to cease.



We had building materials (brick, gravel, sand) that remained in a vacant lot next door to us, not getting used. The construction made some headway the two weeks that it had before the quarantine but not an inch of progress in the 7 weeks since. We hope it picks up May 10 when the quarantine is lifted and we can get a lot more done. It is obvious that we will not be able to finish it on this trip and much will remain when we come back later this year to coordinate and get completed.



April 20 - Things are certainly different here than in the US. Recently the mayor came by and gave out free 'live' chickens. I missed the butchering that our youth leader Angie carried out but I did get to enjoy the meal. A few days later the mayor made a similar offer and we got another, rather plump one. This one had a prominent comb on the head so I figured we got a rooster. But I must have said that out loud so our 'rooster' gave us an egg the next morning. Now it has been many many days since getting that one egg, so I have been doing some online education reading about winter months, molting season, no eggs. Great! Oh well, guess we will be having chicken



People are getting quite restless to get back to work. Peru seems to be copying the US and putting a debt package together to send stimulus funds to all who are out of work. However in Peru, the people getting paid "under the table" are not on anyone's 'official payroll' so they are not getting counted for the stimulus. I have heard that this could count for as much as 70% of the real labor force in Lima and other metro areas. This is causing a great deal of problems. After the last 2 week extension that the governor made to the quarantine, a lot of them started walking back to the mountains where they came from. They came down from the mountains for the money to send home to their poor families and now there is no money.



An even worse story is for all the Venezuelan legal refugees that are in Peru. They too are not counted for 'stimulus' but are also out of work, told to sit tight even though they can't pay their rent or eat.

A lot of them, even from Ica area where we are, are simply planning to walk back to Venezuela. And it's horrible there, but again, if you can't work you can't eat, how bad can it be. That is no short walk, we are talking thousands of miles. There were a good number of them sleeping on the side of the Pan American Highway. There was a major accident just a few days ago when a truck that didn't see them ended up killing many. It is very sad.



A country like this needs to do something different, something more, not just copy what works in America since this is simply not America.

The above many pictures are some of the homes we have been able to help by putting a weeks worth of food together, and to give. We have hardly scratched the surface. We have far more need than we can handle. We have sent some funds to Lima for a list of Venezuelans that are desperate. If you can help us at all with this need, we have matching gifts available to double the value of what you give, and 100% of your gift is duplicated to 200%.



God bless you. We return to the USA June 15th for a few months but the mission continues with

- planned visits from missionaries,
- Continual **construction** at the mission (always need assist)
- Quarantine to cease May 24th, with a resumption prayerfully of childrens ministry
- Puppet ministry visit in August 2020.
- **Knitting teaching team** prayerful visit from San Diego in August 2020
- **Our 2nd DTS / EDE in June 2021!**
- returning [dental hygienist visit](#) in 2021, **missionary dentists welcome** as well!!
- a hopeful [medical mission trip](#) in 2021 (please, let us know if you know of any medical personnel (doctors or nurses) who might like to join), we have a very receptive clinic we are working with.
